



WHAT TO DO WITH UNUSED STUDY DRUG

- Try to identify a Controlled Substance Public Disposal Location using the DEA website. You can search for your nearest Public Disposal Location by searching “drug disposal near me” in Google Maps, scanning the QR Code to the right, or visiting the DEA website at https://apps.dea.diversion.usdoj.gov/pubdispsearch/spring/main;jsessionid=Ur4V50yiSWZOwnfN9_qnHwcnbQ-nR8LBvGDIUh4S.web2?execution=e1s1



- If you cannot identify a Public Disposal Location near you, you should dispose of the study drug following these recommendations from the FDA:

Follow these simple steps to dispose of medicines in the household trash

MIX
Mix medicines (do not crush tablets or capsules) with an unpalatable substance such as dirt, cat litter, or used coffee grounds;

PLACE
Place the mixture in a container such as a sealed plastic bag;

THROW
Throw the container in your household trash;

SCRATCH OUT
Scratch out all personal information on the prescription label of your empty pill bottle or empty medicine packaging to make it unreadable, then dispose of the container.
